BOARD'S MESSAGE

It has been a very challenging start to 2020 with the bushfires closing Kosciuszko National Park during the summer season and more recently the COVID-19 isolation requirements preventing Easter and autumn holidays at both Pygmy Possum and Castaways.

Now there is some welcome news with Charlotte Pass Snow Resort (CPSR) announcing on 28 May 2020 that winter season operations will commence on 26 June 2020 including a series of wellbeing measures to be implemented to give guests peace-of-mind for their 2020 snow holiday. The Board has established a COVIDSafe committee to plan how Pygmy Possum Lodge could operate safely during the busy winter season. A detailed email was sent to members setting out a number of steps that will be taken at Pygmy Possum Lodge this season. The important thing to note is that visiting Charlotte Pass this winter will be vastly different to any other year and we trust that all members and guests will adhere to strict COVID-19 protocols to ensure their safety and the safety of others. A few key messages from our recent email are as follows:

- We must maintain the 4-square metre social distancing protocols at the lodge so there will be a limit on accommodation of 32 people or 16 people per wing. This is a reduction from our maximum occupancy of 54.
- A COVIDsafe manager will be resident at Pygmy Possum Lodge for the season to ensure all members and guests are aware of and maintain the COVID-19 protocols. Richard Mason, a Board member, has agreed to take on this role and responsibility for the majority of the season.

PYGMY POSSUM LODGE REPORT

The Lodge is not quite as 'perfect' as usual. In 2019, the drought and lack of water meant that the normal pre-season clean was curtailed and the timing of COVID-19 restrictions stopped the March 2020 working bee completely. However, small self-isolating teams have been onsite, and there have been some wonderful achievements.

COVID-19 Preparations

Hand sanitiser and sanitising surface spray (70% alcohol), as well as disposable rubber gloves and wipes, have been deployed around the lodge. The surface spray should be used regularly on commonly touched surfaces like bench tops, light switches, taps and door handles. COVID-19 signage has been placed in the kitchens, lounges and each room. The cleaning store cupboard in the laundry has been re-stocked with adequate supplies for the next 12 months.







Food Store

Due to the uncertainty of the upcoming season, perishable goods have not been re-stocked this year. Food and drink supplies are limited to what was left over from last season. Please refer to the website for a complete list of what is available. If visiting this season, you will need to bring more of your own food supplies.

Non-perishables such as toilet paper, paper towel, foil, cling wrap, hand sanitizer and garbage bags have been re-stocked.

Magnetite treatment to Windows

Magnetite window coverings have been fitted in some bedrooms as a trial. These covers provide double glazing and have improved the room temperature by approximately 6_oC. The covers are fixed magnetically to the existing window frame and are not readily opened. Please do not try and open these new covers. Work on this type of window covering is ongoing. For winter we rely on the vents of the bathroom exhaust fans to supply fresh air to the bedrooms.

Second Washing Machine

A second heavy duty washing machine has been installed as a back-up for the now aging but still very serviceable machine.

New doonas, pillows and beds - no more double beds!

All the standard double beds in the lodge have been removed and replaced with either queen or long doubles, depending on the size of the room. New doonas have been provided for all beds. They are very warm with 85% duck down/15% duck feather fill and baffled cassette construction to eliminate cold spots. They've been tested already as it snowed the weekend they were rolled out and the lodge was very cold. You will find double quilts on the single and king single beds, and king quilts on queen and long double beds.

Visitors with allergy issues, or those who really feel the cold and need an extra layer, can find spare microfibre doonas in the storerooms on the upper bedroom level.

60 new pillows have been distributed equally throughout the bedrooms.

Stoves

The remaining new stoves have been installed in both wings. All the stoves are now updated and fully functional and importantly safe for all to use. Note that the simmer settings on the burners are not as low as we expected so metal simmer mats (2 per kitchen) have been provided. Use them with the points (half-domes) face up on the gas stoves.









Vacuum Cleaners

New cordless vacuum cleaners have been installed in each dining area in the communal lounge/dining areas. They will also be very handy for the stairs. Their charge time is limited so please continue to use the corded vacuum cleaners at the end of the week when cleaning your rooms.

DO YOU HAVE UNWANTED SKI GEAR?

Consider donating any unwanted ski gear to a charity that supports homeless people. Member Michael Stevens writes:

"If you are like me you will have bought ski clothing over the years and now have a cupboard full of stuff that you never wear. A couple of years ago I cleaned out the family ski gear cupboard and took it to the Wayside Chapel in Kings Cross in Sydney. The Wayside is a day refuge for homeless people who sleep rough in the open. There they can get a meal, have a shower and get clean clothes. Ski clothing is welcome because it keeps them warm. Parkas, skivvies, jumpers, sox, beanies, gloves, track pants and over-pants soon find a new owner. Some lucky person got a down jacket or a sleeping bag. Each year I seem to find something else to give them. If it was given to Vinnies it would generally be sold and not given to someone in need.

Now I ask you to join me and look through your ski gear and donate any surplus items that are clean and serviceable to the Wayside or similar charities that look after the homeless. Similar organisations will be found in other cities and some of them may have a need for children's clothes. April / May is a good time to do this when the cold weather arrives and keep in mind that the homeless need summer clothes in the summer."

OTHER SNOWY MOUNTAIN NEWS

The drought and the Dunn's Valley fire have impacted the habitat of mountain pygmy possums. Food and water stations have been established in boulder fields to help the possums through their hibernation. Specially formulated Bogong biscuits have been baked. These replicate the nutritional value of bogong moths which is a principle food source of the pygmy possum. Other native animals including the common native bush rat, dusky antechinus, mountain brush-tailed possums and black rock skinks are also using the feeding stations.

Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct (SMSAP) is a funding initiative by NSW Government to fund Kosciuszko National Park, including Charlotte Pass, to encourage year-round tourism. Funds will come from the \$4.2 billion Snowy Hydro Legacy Fund. The draft Master Plan and technical studies will be released for public exhibition in early 2021.
